# Our priorities for 2025-28

#### **Disability rights**

- Equal access for people with disability to services including transport, housing and digital services and emerging technologies.
- A fairer NDIS delivering people the supports they need for full and equal participation in their communities.
- Empowering people with disability to drive systemic change through law and policy reform processes, including the co-design of enforceable standards for air travel.

#### **First Nations justice**

 Transforming the NSW child protection system to deliver better outcomes for Aboriginal children and families, and reduce the numbers of Aboriginal children being removed by government.

- Challenging and changing laws and practices that drive the overrepresentation of Aboriginal children and adults in the criminal legal system.
- Increased community understanding through truth-telling about the impact of laws and government policies on Aboriginal people in NSW since 1788, as a basis for repair and reform.

#### **Homelessness**

- Better targeted and coordinated access to legal and related help for people experiencing homelessness.
- The legal needs of women experiencing or at risk of homelessness and victim/ survivors of domestic, sexual and family violence are better met by traumainformed, holistic services.
- Advocates with lived experience of homelessness have greater influence over policy and practice, to decrease homelessness and better meet the needs of those who are experiencing homelessness or in insecure housing.

#### **Civil rights**

- Stronger human rights protections for LGBTQ students and teachers in religious schools, people with disability and other groups facing discrimination, including through modernised anti-discrimination legislation.
- Raising the minimum age of criminal responsibility in NSW to 14, with better services and supports for children and families delivering safer communities.
- Police accountability for unlawful, unfair or improper use of power on overpoliced groups in NSW, particularly young people, people experiencing homelessness and First Nations people.
- Securing humane conditions in immigration detention facilities with robust safeguards to provide timely access to healthcare and significantly limit the use of handcuffs and other

#### **Energy and water justice**

- An accelerated transition to a zerocarbon economy which enables all people to benefit from affordable renewable energy and efficient, electrified homes.
- Energy system planning, regulation and investment delivers equitable outcomes for NSW household consumers.
- Energy services better meet consumer needs, including through simpler, more effective and accessible price protections.
- More effective support for households through rebates, emergency support and government assistance to reduce disconnections and support affordability.





# How we will work



### 1 Partnerships and alliances

Social change happens when we work with others, leveraging our skills, expertise and relationships to deliver greater impact. We will build on our reputation as a generous and effective collaborator by:

- Reviewing and improving our practice in collaboration, partnerships and alliances.
- Developing new collaborations, partnerships and alliances to build community power and capacity to effect change.

### 2 Enhancing our influence

To make breakthrough change, we need specialist skills in advocacy and public engagement. We will:

- Build our capacity and skills in key areas to drive change, including government relations and strategic communications.
- Enhance the role of lived experience advocacy, supported by our technical expertise.

### 3 Demonstrating impact

Impact drives our strategy. We measure our impact to support effective planning, management, evaluation and reporting. We will continue to develop this capacity by:

- Embedding impact frameworks in planning, review and reporting across all of our work.
- Innovating and enhancing our methodology for measuring and communicating impact, including through story-telling.

### 4 Working well together

The breadth and depth of skills and experience in our team is unique. We will make the most of this by:

- Increasing internal collaboration to leverage skills and strengths.
- Supporting staff wellbeing through an inclusive, diverse and flexible workplace.

#### 5 Capacity and sustainability

To build our capacity for long-term systemic advocacy and innovative responses to complex social justice issues we will:

- Develop a long-term fundraising strategy to further diversify and grow our financial base.
- Seek to secure increased untied funding, with reduced reliance on programmatic funding.
- Position ourselves as an employer of choice in our sector with competitive conditions that will support recruitment and retention.
